- Name of the Applicant, Working group(s) to which the Applicant belongs and Short motivation letter explaining why the applicant wants to take part in the workshop and how it can contribute to the objectives of the WG (max 1 page in total);
- Short CV (max 1 page).

Selection of Participants will be made based on the submitted application, considering the COST principles, notably Excellence and Inclusiveness Policy. The results of the selection will be announced not later than 31 January 2024.
